As part of our European Refugee Crisis initiative, we are looking for a Logistics Administrator to join the Search and Rescue Maritime team for a 6-week period, based in Sicily, Italy and operating across the Mediterranean Sea.

In this role you will support the Search & Rescue team on shore. You will have oversight and responsibility for staff travel and movement within Italy. You will also be the first point of contact for staff queries, and will liaise closely with the team based in London. Other responsibilities will include:

- Orientate new staff members on their arrival to Sicily, ensuring they know where the office and accommodation are located in Sicily.
- Guesthouses management: be main contact with the landlords in case of need. Help to identify new guesthouses if needed.
- Make arrangements for deployment onto the vessel (which could be at any port in Sicily) and to assist with disembarkation arrangements for those coming off the vessel.
- Make arrangements for pre-deployment training when necessary
- Maintain a personnel movement tracker, liaising closely with the HR/Operations Assistant.
- Monitor stock and supplies of office materials for printers, copiers and ensure they are in optimal functional conditions
- Manage the appropriate filing of hard and soft procurement and logistics documents under the support and supervision of the logistics manager.
- Carry out some local purchasing under the support and supervision of the logistics manager.
